

- SH 34 and FM 1550 relocations should be complete in early 2023
- Leon HurseDam should be complete and begin impounding water in early 2024
- Mitigation construction will be ongoing perhaps into 2025
- Pipeline construction should be complete in early 2025

Once the dam is complete and Upper Trinity starts impounding water, the lake will begin to fill. Depending on rainfall during the following months, the lake should be full within three to four years, but in case of a severe drought it could take as much as seven years.

Obviously any of these dates remain subject to change due to circumstances beyond our control.

Conclusion:

Ladonia and Upper Trinity established a partnership and embarked on a long journey to develop Lake Ralph Hall over twenty years ago. Upper Trinity values the support received from the citizens of Ladonia and Fannin County. We look forward to continuing our partnership and working with Ladonia to fulfill the vision of Leon Hurse and others in the community for a lake in your own back yard.
